#### CHRISTMAS BASKET PROGRAM



It's that time of the year again when the PCPC participates in the Community Christmas Basket Program. This program provides food for needy families that live within the Jonathan Alder school district. Gifts are also provided for the children in each family. This is truly a community effort which offers several ways for those wishing to assist:

• You can donate money that will be used to buy the food and gifts for the families. Please make checks payable to: **Christmas Basket Fund**.

• You can adopt a family in need which means you buy the children's gifts (suggested amount per child is \$20-\$25) and also provide \$30 for a family gift certificate which is pur-

chased from a local merchant. Please make checks payable to: Christmas Basket Fund.

- You can help pack the baskets on the morning of Saturday, December 21st. Coffee, juice and donuts will be provided at 8am and the packing will begin at 9am.
- You can help deliver the baskets and gifts to the families on Saturday, December 21st. The delivery timeframe is from 10:30am until 1:00pm (or until done most likely before 1:00pm).

You can help by doing any combination of the above items that you are comfortable with. Any help will be greatly appreciated and remember... you are helping people that live in your own community! Please contact Dave McCray (614-408-1617) to donate money or to adopt a family. If you wish to help pack the baskets or deliver them (or both) then you can simply be at our church at the appropriate time on Saturday, December 21st.

# If you have adopted a family with children please follow these guidelines for wrapping/bagging the gifts:

1. Wrap and label each gift with the family number and age and sex of child – We suggest about \$25 per child but some people spend more as this may be only gifts the children receive.

2. Bring all gifts to church for the family in a large garbage bag with the family number on it.

3. Please do <u>not</u> use staples and do <u>not</u> tie bags together if you happen to have more than one bag. Also do not tie your garbage bags so tightly that they cannot be opened. I go through every bag to check to make sure that there are gifts for each child listed. It's the busy season and people get sidetracked. Sometimes there are gifts missing. Sometimes children in one family haven't gotten equal gifts – maybe different people had each child. So we often add to the bags. We do get separate gifts sometimes and that helps us add when needed. We have even opened suspicious gifts if they look light.

4. We also get miscellaneous gifts such as mittens, crayon, books, etc that we need to add to bags.

5. If you get teenagers and want to purchase a gift certificate <u>as the gift (not in lieu of the \$30 certificate)</u>, please <u>mark the amount</u> <u>on the outside of the gift card or box</u>. I can take the label off but we need to know how much the gift card is for. Gift certificates to Wal-Mart or Meijer for example buy more, but that is up to your individual preference. Hats, ball caps, gloves, hair bobbles, scarves, gift cards to McDonalds or pizza shops, Bath and Body works, wallets - those are nice gifts for teenagers. I would not get a gift certificate for a child under 12. Sometimes this is all the children get.
