

Church Treasurer Report for December 2021

The general fund balance for the end of December increased due to a number of large donations being made during the month. There were a number of larger expenses in addition to the normal monthly items. The quarterly insurance premium, numerous Christmas gifts, and the annual benevolences were paid.

General Expenses Fund

Beginning Balance 12/01/2021 \$ 9,079.03

Income 31,147.70

Expenses (27,167.65)

Ending Balance 12/31/2021 \$ 13,059.08

The following benevolences were paid: Plain City Food Pantry \$2,500; Daily Needs Assistance \$3,000; Plain City Ministerial Association \$300; Presbyterian Church General Mission \$750; Deacons \$50. In addition, the Session decided to tithe general funds of \$2,184 for future local mission projects.

Donations were also received for Presbyterian Church Disaster Assistance to Kentucky tornado relief in the amount of \$1,500. \$110 was donated for the Christmas Joy offering.
