Word from Pastor Alice

Dear Church Family,



It is New Year's Eve as I write this newsletter article. I have many fond memories from my childhood celebrating New Year's Eve and New Year's Day. In the evening on New Year's Eve, all our relatives would gather at the home of my Aunt Helen and Uncle Dave where my Grandma also lived. My Grandma, my parents, and aunts and uncles watched Guy Lombardo, which we kids thought was dreadful! An uncle would bring smoked fish...with the head on...that was even worse looking at that thing than listening to Guy Lombardo! We kids found the potato chips and other food much more appealing! We kids played together and had fun and couldn't wait until midnight when we would gather pots and pans and spoons. Together on the front porch we would bang them together creating lots of unmelodic noise and with lots of laughter we would shout, "Happy New Year!!" From the website, "Keeping clean is an important part of remaining healthy, but families who have fled their homes because of a disaster or war often struggle to afford these necessary supplies. Hygiene kits are also given through schools or orphanages to encourage healthy habits in children. **55,115** hygiene kits shipped last year to Jordan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Korea, Ukraine, Iraq, Canada, and the United States."
