Word from Pastor Alice

Dear Church Family,



I recently listened to a sermon Bob Russell preached. He spoke about the prophetess Anna and how she waited at the temple year after year in anticipation of one day seeing the Messiah. Within his sermon Bob shared the following...

She could have said that morning...I'm 84, I've been through the routine before...I'll just watch online today and send in my offering. She would have missed the most significant moment of her life.

Online church is for the shut-in. Online church is for the vulnerable. If you can go to the grocery store, if you can go to the ball games, you can come to church. Online church is not church...it is a good front porch but not the living room. Would a lover be satisfied to Facetime his fiancée rather than be with her in person? I think not! In the Bible the church is a connected body with ligaments that join together not a bunch of bones scattered in the field. It is a building of blocks that are cemented together. It is not blocks that are in the weeds.

He continued to share of how when visiting his son's church in Florida, he needed a haircut. His son sent him to a salon that a Puerto Rican woman owned. He struck up a conversation with her while she was cutting his hair. He asked how she started coming to New Day Church.

She said years ago, I was going through a tough divorce, and I needed something. I heard about the church so I wandered in a little late. The place was packed and there was only one seat I could see near the back. I scooted in beside this older woman. She smiled at me. We started the service; and the music was so moving and the Holy Spirit so present, I just couldn't quit crying. And this older woman reached over her hand and patted me on the knee and said, "You've come to the right place." Next Sunday I went back and thought I wish I could sit with that older woman again as she was so kind to me. I walked in and the same seat was available. I sat beside her, and she greeted me warmly. As we worshiped, I thought I wish I had this woman's phone number. She seems like somebody I could talk to, and I really need to talk to somebody. At the end of the service, the elderly woman handed me a scrap of paper and said, "Here's my number if you ever need to call me, give me a call." That led to a luncheon, and a friendship, and this girl giving her life to Christ. Let me tell you,

I don't think that happens online. If you are focusing on the owner of the hair salon, I want you to focus on that older woman. She could have said, I can get just as much out of it watching on TV. But she didn't come to church for what she received, she came for what she could give. And that doesn't happen if you aren't hanging around church with expectancy.

Hebrews 10:24-25 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

We need one another to stand firm and be reaffirmed to faithfulness.

I thought Bob's words were so fitting for today. I encourage you to start the year off right and be at church. I know these are trying times, and I know COVID is at a high. We are keeping the church as safe as possible with masks and sanitizing. It is just as safe, if not safer, than the grocery stores, Walmart, ball games, and other outings.

We need one another during these difficult days! Seek to worship the Lord together with your church family in the sanctuary as we anxiously await His return. Don't miss out on the ways in which the Lord may touch your life or the ways in which you may touch the lives of others as we seek to be the united body of Christ.



- 1. A pastor can visit if he/she is listed as one of the two visitors (that is all any patient is allowed) on the patient's chart. Most likely this will not be the case as family members are usually the two listed.
- 2. If patient or family requests the pastor to visit, a contact is made through the chaplain's office. The pastor is contacted by the office for a one time visit.
- 3. If someone is terminally ill, this is an exception...however, visits must still be cleared through the nursing staff.

<u>PLEASE KNOW SHE WILL VISIT ANY CHURCH MEMBER SHOULD YOU OR YOUR FAMILY MAKE A REQUEST.</u> DURING THIS COVID MESS THAT IS THE ONLY WAY – SHE CANNOT JUST FREELY WALK INTO A HOSPITAL AS IN THE PAST PRIOR TO COVID.

This makes her heart sad as she believes pastoral calling is an essential part of ministry...but this is the way it is for now. But please know that she will gladly pray on the phone with hospitalized individuals as she has been and will continue to do. She will also gladly visit you at home before surgery to pray in person.
