Word from Pastor Alice



Dear Church Family,

I remember several years ago hearing Rev. Dr. Lloyd Ogilvie at The Cove. Lloyd was a Presbyterian pastor and Senate chaplain and author of numerous books. He went home to Jesus a couple years ago. His seminar was devoted to the "He is able" passages in Scripture.

In the midst of all the confusion we are living in today, perhaps you and I need to be reminded that God is still on the throne and God is able!

God is able to provide for you:

"And God is ABLE to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work" (2 Cor. 9:8).

God is able to do more than you can ask or imagine:

"Now to Him who is ABLE to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, to Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen" (Eph. 3:20-21).

God is able to deliver you:

"For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, He is ABLE to aid those who are tempted" (Heb. 2:18).

God is able to keep what you have committed to Him:

"For this reason I also suffer these things; nevertheless I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is ABLE to keep what I have committed to Him until that Day" (2 Tim. 1:12).

God is able to establish you:

"Now to Him who is ABLE to establish you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery kept secret since the world began" (Rom. 16:25).

God is able to keep you from falling:

"Now unto him that is ABLE to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy, To the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen" (Jude 24-25).

God is able to save you to the end and intercedes for you:

"Therefore He is also ABLE to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Heb. 7:25).



THANK YOU to Rita McCray and Jim and Karon Kaufman for helping Rev Alice deliver communion kits to shut-ins and those who have no internet access.




Monday Night Prayer and Bible Study began a new study on Romans on January 11. If you would like to join us, please let Rev Alice know and she will send the Zoom connection.

Church Treasurer Report for January 2021

The general fund for the month of January ended with a strong balance, with expenses being within normal for the month, and having a strong carryover from December. An additional contribution of around \$6,000 was credited for 2020. While the weekly average donations were down from the end of last year, the month also had five weeks of donations so donations matched closely to expenses.

Update on Number of Board Members:

Session decided to change the number of board members beginning with the class of 2021. This decision was made realizing the number of board members for the size of our church seemed out of balance along with the fact that people were serving many years without a break. So beginning in 2021, we will be electing two trustees and three deacons. This will continue each year until the number of board members by 2023 will be six instead of nine trustees, and the number of deacons will be nine instead of twelve. The Elders will remain the same at nine members.
