Word from Pastor Alice

Dear Church Family...

Reader's Digest posted the following story:

When Mrs. Klein told her first graders to draw a picture of something for which they were thankful, she thought how little these children, who lived in a deteriorating neighborhood, actually had to be thankful for. She knew that most of the class would draw pictures of turkeys or of bountifully laden Thanksgiving tables. That was what they believed was expected of them.

What took Mrs. Klein aback was Douglas's picture. Douglas was so forlorn and likely to be found close in her shadow as they went outside for recess. Douglas's drawing was simply this:

A hand, obviously, but whose hand? The class was captivated by his image. "I think it must be the hand of God that brings us food," said one student.

"A farmer," said another, "because they grow the turkeys."

"It looks more like a policeman, and they protect us." "I think," said Lavinia, who was always so serious, "that it is supposed to be all the hands that help us, but Douglas could only draw one of them."

Mrs. Klein had almost forgotten Douglas in her pleasure at finding the class so responsive. When she had the others at work on another project, she bent over his desk and asked whose hand it was.

Douglas mumbled, "It's yours, Teacher."

Then Mrs. Klein recalled that she had taken Douglas by the hand from time to time; she often did that with the children. But that it should have meant so much to Douglas ...

Perhaps, she reflected, this was her Thanksgiving, and everybody's Thanksgiving—not the material things given unto us, but the small ways that we give something to others.

Blessings upon Willy Gordon and Janell Wilcox who expressed their love to one another in a Commitment Service on October 30, 2021.





Community Christmas Basket Program - 2021

We are having the program this year but in a modified format. There will be no food collection/distribution. Our church will NOT be the home base for operations this year – there is no home base this year.

If you want to adopt a family you will be responsible for providing \$30 for a family gift card, buying any gifts for the children, and wrapping them. This year you have the option of arranging to deliver the gifts to the family, arranging to have them picked up by the family or bringing the gifts to our church and we will make sure they get to the family. You can

bring the \$30/family to the Plain City Presbyterian Church on Monday, 11/22/2021 between 6 and 7pm and you will be given the family gift card and an index card that will contain the family information: Name, address, phone number, children's ages and gender (so you can purchase age appropriate gifts). We also have families that do not have any children so you would just give us the \$30 for the family gift card and then you have the option to contact the family to arrange for pick up or delivery of this gift card or you can leave it with us and we will make sure the family gets the gift card. If you choose to contact the family yourself to arrange for pickup or delivery of the gifts we ask that you contact the family by Wednesday, December 15, 2021.

SAFETY GUIDELINES!

1. No longer will temps be taken at the door. If you are not feeling well or have been exposed to Covid, please stay home and watch online.

2. All vaccinated individuals are no longer required to wear masks. Due to the rise in the delta variant The Scioto Valley Presbytery in their weekly news today said: *It is very strongly advised by our Presbytery Coordinating Team that masks be worn indoors regardless of vaccination status.* <u>The Elders of Plain City Presbyterian Church are strongly advising all to wear masks on Sunday morning.</u> This is NOT a mandate. We are leaving the decision up to each individual.

3. Sanitizing will still continue.

We will continue to revisit this as things change. Session approved reopening of our building this fall to outside groups with appropriate restrictions.

Hospital Visitation Updates

VISITATIONS *<u>Update</u>* - Marysville Hospital is allowing clergy to visit!!!

1. A pastor can visit if he/she is listed as one of the two visitors (that is all any patient is allowed) on the patient's chart. Most likely this will not be the case as family members are usually the two listed.

2. If patient or family requests the pastor to visit, a contact is made through the chaplain's office. The pastor is contacted by the office for a one time visit.

3. If someone is terminally ill, this is an exception...however, visits must still be cleared through the nursing staff.

<u>PLEASE KNOW SHE WILL VISIT ANY CHURCH MEMBER SHOULD YOU OR YOUR FAMILY MAKE A REQUEST</u>. DURING THIS COVID MESS THAT IS THE ONLY WAY – SHE CANNOT JUST FREELY WALK INTO A HOSPITAL AS IN THE PAST PRIOR TO COVID.

This makes her heart sad as she believes pastoral calling is an essential part of ministry...but this is the way it is for now. But please know that she will gladly pray on the phone with hospitalized individuals as she has
