
To Jill Berry Dunham for donating a real looking, life sized baby doll to be used for baby Jesus at Christmas.

Church Treasurer Report for July 2023

The general fund balance for the end of July was down slightly from last month due to lower donations during the month, even with five weeks of donations included. Expenses were as expected.

Building repair expenses were paid from the Major Church Repair Fund to Durable Slate in the amount of \$14,220 in addition to \$1,175 paid to Golden Bear for door repairs, so the July 31st balance is now at \$21,450. This included \$225 of memorial donations which go to this fund.
