Word from Pastor Alice

Dear Church Family,

Alfred Ackley was in the midst of a weeklong revival in 1934 at which those who turned out were by and large looking for answers and comfort. The Great Depression had all but wiped them out. Many men had lost their jobs, while the lucky ones who still had employment were wondering if their jobs would last until the end of the year. A new president had promised that help was on the way, but for the moment those seemed like hollow words as the bleak times continued. For many, the only place to turn to find any hope at all was God. So in revivals across the country, thousands were filling churches, theaters, auditoriums, and tents looking for answers.

Ackley, who was an accomplished musician, was also a pastor. He began his ministry at a Presbyterian Church in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, and also pastored churches in Pittsburgh and Escondido, California.

Ackley was one of the evangelists called upon to speak all across the country. His mission was to steer the lost to Christ and bring comfort and hope to hurting believers. Though he had more than twenty years' experience as a pastor and Christian leader, the task he now faced was anything but routine or easy. Despair seemed to be permanently etched on many of the faces that looked up at him night after night. That hopelessness often seemed to descend on the services like a storm cloud on a summer afternoon.

Each night of the revival, Ackley noted a young man in the audience who came alone and sat well away from others in crowd. The visitor listened intently but showed no signs of understanding either the message or the music. He also never came forward to ask a question, seek prayer, or make a decision for Christ. Yet he was always back the next evening. On the final night, thirty minutes after the crowd had dispersed and Ackley was also getting ready to leave, a voice stopped him. Turning the evangelist was greeted by the young man he had noticed earlier. The stranger's expression was intense and his body coiled tight with suppressed rage. "I have to know something," the stranger barked. "Yes," the evangelist quietly replied. "Why," he demanded, "should I worship a dead Jew?"

The question stunned Ackley. No one had ever asked it before. For a moment he thought about how to answer, then he felt a sudden rush of energy and blurted out, "He lives! I tell you, he is not dead, but lives here and now! Jesus Christ is more alive today than ever before. I can prove it by my own experience, as well as the testimony of countless others." Excitement flowed through his body as Ackley stared intently into the young man's eyes. The visitor's rage was gone, replaced by a sense of surprise. He was now ready to listen, and Ackley was ready to witness. Signaling toward two chairs, the evangelist sat down and shared his own story with the young man. When their conversation ended, they prayed together. Each left knowing that belief in a living Christ was a tie that would bind them through this life and the next.

That night Ackley's reply to the young man's question stuck with him that he could not sleep, unable to read, and unable to even pray. Ackley got up and found a piano and what resulted was one the most beautiful hymns,

He Lives!

I serve a risen Savior, He's in the world today I know that He is living, whatever men may say I see His hand of mercy, I hear His voice of cheer And just the time I need Him He's always near

He lives (He lives), He lives (He lives), Christ Jesus lives today He walks with me and talks with me

Along life's narrow way He lives (He lives), He lives (He lives), Salvation to impart You ask me how I know He lives? He lives within my heart

In all the world around me I see His loving care And though my heart grows weary I never will despair I know that He is leading, through all the stormy blast The day of His appearing will come at last REFRAIN

Rejoice, rejoice, O Christian Lift up your voice and sing Eternal hallelujahs to Jesus Christ, the King The Hope of all who seek Him, the Help of all who find None other is so loving, so good and kind REFRAIN

If someone asked you how you know Jesus lives...how would you respond? Would you be willing to share how Jesus lives within your heart and the many ways you see His presence in daily life?


